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


St. Rita Students Seek to Clear Air Space for Drones

East Palestine Changes Its Name to East Israel In Order To Receive More Money From the U.S. Government

East Palestine, Ohio is in a very undesirable predicament right now. Even a month after the train derailment that spilled toxic chemicals into multiple nearby streams, which poisoned the water and the surrounding environment, the town has failed to receive a much stronger response from the federal government and Norfolk Southern, only receiving a little under \$10 million to help pay for the clean up and testing efforts along with a hilariously tiny \$25,000 pity donation to the Red Cross from a railway company worth billions of dollars.

"The amount of support from Norfolk Southern and the government we've gotten is pitiful," said Mayor Trent R. Conaway. "Many independent research teams from universities have come to East Palestine to test for dangerous materials and found many that the EPA was unable to locate. Worst response I've ever seen from the EPA in my life," continued Conaway

Many across the community were confused why they didn't receive as much support as they thought they would, especially considering that the accident contained toxic chemicals that might harm the environment and the fact that Biden ran on making America more environmentally friendly. But then the town council had an epiphany one night in their sleep: the reason they weren't receiving as much money as they should have is because the town's name was East Palestine. The federal government refuses to support Palestine because they are the enemy of Israel, who is largely supported by the United States.

The next day, the town council held an emergency meeting to discuss a potential name change for the town. They decided to rename the town as "East Israel" so they can convince the federal government to give them more money because they will technically be supporting Israel.

A week after the emergency meeting, the town council held a referendum to change the town's name to East Israel. The town's residents were almost unanimously supportive of changing the name. "It's about time that the government gave this town more money to help support cleanup efforts," said resident Bill Jones. "Who knows? Maybe the government will continue to shower the town with money even long after they no longer need the money for cleanup and testing efforts," said Ryan O' Malley, another resident of East Palestine.

The town council held a vote, and the name change was unanimously approved. Mere days later, President Biden personally showed up to Mayor Conaway's house to give him a blank cheque and instructions to write down any amount of money they want on the cheque. "This cheque is a symbol of a great relationship between the federal government and East Israel," said Biden. "We were hesitant about supporting a town with 'Palestine' in its name, but once they changed their name to 'Israel', we knew it was finally the right time to step in. We are willing to give them any amount of money they want, even if it is completely unreasonable and unnecessary. We want to keep this great relationship, even if we are giving a lot more than we are receiving."
